Step 1: Read the three situations and the accompanying questions. Circle whether you think “no” or “yes” for each situation. Then explain.



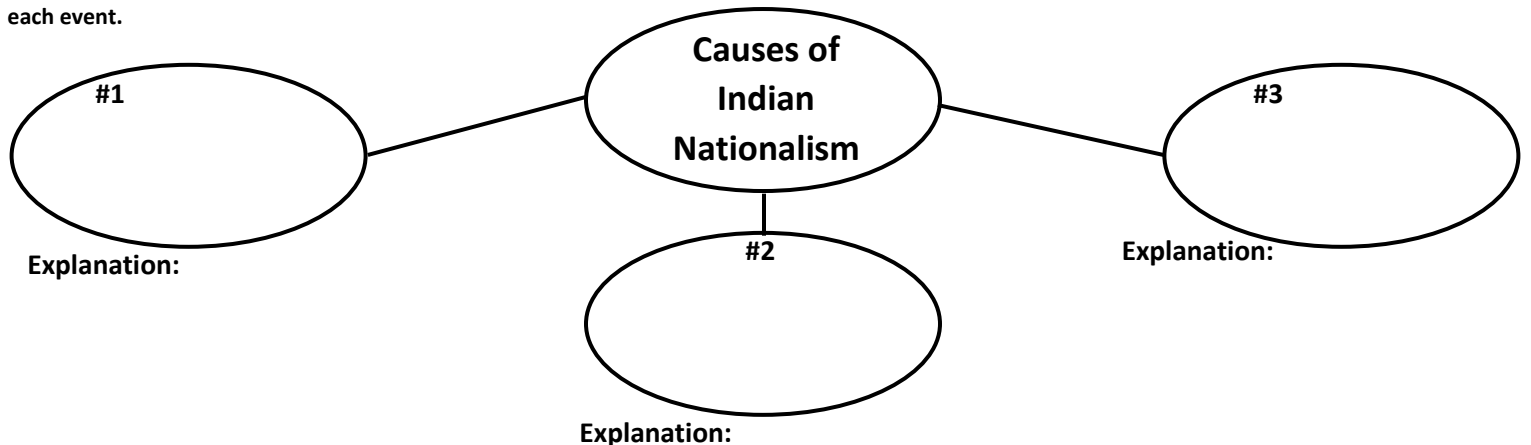
Religion in India

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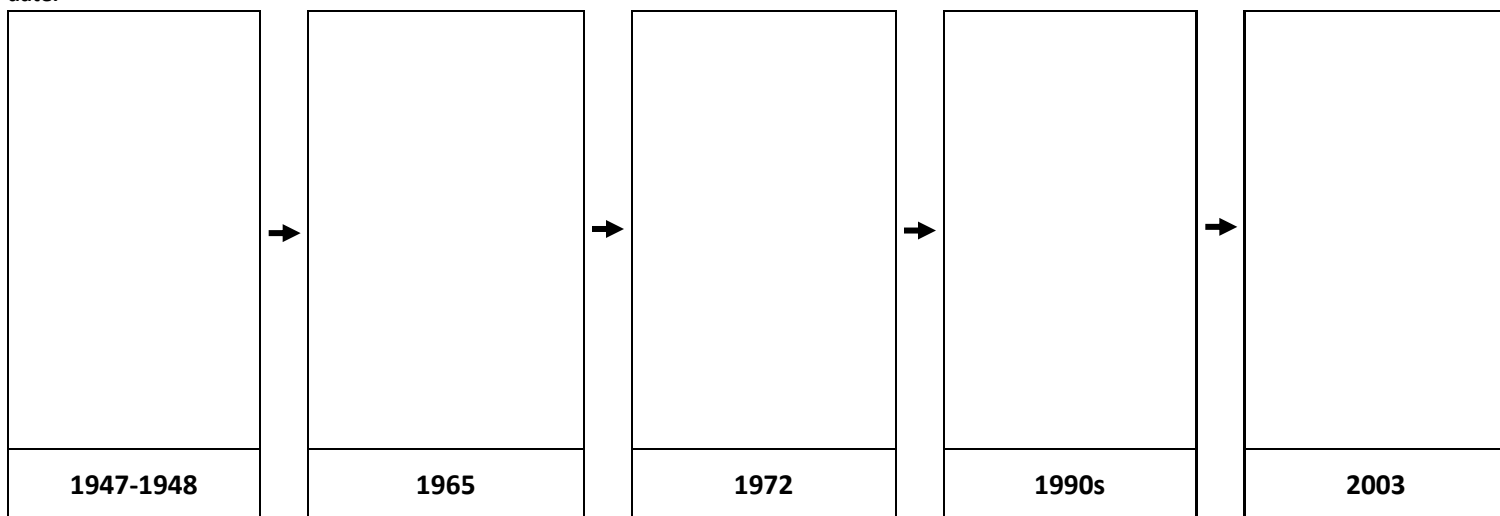
